1. Introduction



3. Basic Training Course - Summary of Activities

The Basic Training Course focused on foundational principles, practices, and discipline that form the core of the Scouts and Guides movement. The following topics and activities were covered:

3.1 Scout Values and Discipline

- Scout Promise Understanding the commitment to duty, community service, and personal integrity.
- Scout Law Learning the core principles guiding the character and conduct of Scouts.
- Scout Prayer Instilling spirituality and dedication.
- National Anthem Observing protocol and respect.
- Scout Flag Song Learning the significance and proper rendition of the song.

3.2 Protocols and Etiquette

- Three Flags and Flag Etiquette Procedures for hoisting, lowering, and saluting flags.
- Flag Procedure Proper handling and display of the Scout flag at camps and events.
- Four Bonds in Scouts Understanding the essential relationships in scouting:
 - 1. Bond with Self
 - 2. Bond with Others
 - 3. Bond with Nature
 - 4. Bond with God/Spirituality

3.3 Practical Scouting Skills

- Knots and Lashings Practicing essential knots for survival, pioneering, and camp construction.
- Estimation Techniques Methods to estimate height, distance, and width using scouting tools.
- Mapping Basics of map reading, compass usage, and route sketching.
- Camp Craft Setting up camps, tent pitching, gadgets, and maintaining campsite hygiene.

3.4 First Aid and Physical Training

- First Aid Introduction to emergency response, bandaging, injury management, and safety protocols.
- BP-6 Exercises Physical drills inspired by Baden-Powell's methods for fitness and agility.

• Daily Sketches – Recording daily activities and reflections to develop discipline and observation skills.

3.5 Cultural and Team-Building Activities

• Songs and Yells – Encouraging team spirit, enthusiasm, and unity during group activities and campfires.

4. Advanced Training Course - Summary of Activities

The Advanced Training Course, attended by Dr. Martin Joel Rathnam, provided an in-depth extension of the Basic Course. It included:

- Advanced Practical Sessions focusing on leadership, camp management, and disaster response.
- Enhanced Training in Knots, Lashings, and Pioneering Projects such as building structures and models using natural materials.
- Comprehensive First Aid and Emergency Preparedness Modules.
- Improvised Mapping and Navigation Techniques, including field navigation exercises.
- Detailed Sessions on Scout Leadership, troop management, and training methodologies.
- More Rigorous Physical Training and Outdoor Activities designed to build endurance and tactical skill.

The sessions were more interactive, hands-on, and scenario-based to develop deeper competence and confidence in handling real-time scouting responsibilities.
