

Report IEEEXTREME 19.0 Programming Competition

IEEEXtreme is a global challenge in which teams of IEEE Student members – advised and proctored by an IEEE member, and often supported by an IEEE Student Branch – compete in a 24-hour time span against each other to solve a set of programming problems.

- Great way to test and sharpen your coding & problem-solving skills under pressure and in a team setting.
- Useful addition to your CV/resume: participating in a global competition run by IEEE gives
 credibility and shows initiative.
- Networking & peer learning: you'll be competing alongside students worldwide, which can expose you to different approaches and cultures in coding.
- Prizes & recognition: For IEEEXtreme 19.0, the prize structure outlined includes:
 - 1st place: trip to an IEEE conference of your choice (return airfare + registration +
 3-night hotel)
 - o 2nd place: each team member gets US\$ 400 cash.
 - o 3rd place: US\$ 300 each.
 - o 4th-10th place: special merchandise bundle.
 - o 11th-20th place and top 3 in each region: merchandise bundle.
- Certificates: Any team that scores ≥1 point will be able to download a certificate of participation.

Eligibility, Team & Format Basics

- Teams must consist of 1 to 3 members who are IEEE Student or Graduate Student members. At most 2 of the members can be Graduate Students.
- You must locate a Proctor (an IEEE member of higher grade than Student/Graduate Student) for your team. That proctor may monitor remotely or in person.
- The competition starts at 00:00 UTC on the competition date (for that region) and runs 24 hours.

Teams are expected to solve coding tasks without external assistance (no help from others, including the proctor beyond monitoring/logistics).


Key Details for IEEEXtreme 19.0

- Date: 25 October 2025.
- Registration deadline: Some sources show October 14, 2025.
- Virtual attendance is allowed (teams can participate from home or campus) the event is location-agnostic provided you have a good internet connection and follow the rules.

- Report to the IEEEXtreme committee that the team(s) completed the contest according to the rules.
- Provide feedback:
 - o Optionally report any incidents or issues encountered during the event.

(Time Commitment

- The Proctor must be available for the entire 24-hour duration of the contest.
- Can supervise multiple teams, provided they are in the same location.

Ethics and Conduct

- Proctors must not assist with problem-solving or debugging.
- Maintain impartiality and confidentiality of all problems and submissions.
- Report any suspected cheating or rule violations to IEEE immediately.

Summary

In short: **Yes**, registering for IEEEXtreme 19.0 is a strong opportunity — provided you can quickly assemble a team, pick a proctor, register and prepare. It's a global event with prestige, challenge and learning built-in.
